

CALSCA activities in 2021 included:

- <u>seeking</u> improved non-car 'active' access in both directions between our community and Snug. This resulted in a Council feasibility study on extension of the Margate to Snug shared pathway. Council's draft Cycling Strategy 2021-2030 include actions [# 36, 34 & 38] which address issues raised by CALSCA.
- participation in the UTAS Menzies Institute Walkability Project to measure 'walkability' as seen by local 'citizen scientists'. This will lead to recommendations to Council on ways to improve walkability, as improving the safety and ease of walking around the community will have significant health, economic and community benefits. CALSCA committee member Deb Lie is our representative for the local study. A presentation on this project will be given at the AGM.
- sponsorship of an ePetition to Council seeking improvements on road safety in our community, which led to a report accepted by Council and consultations with CALSCA on appropriate measures. This has led to improvements in signage, including to increase safety awareness.
- > drawing Council's attention to where road repairs and resealing are needed in our community.
- initiating and implementing the Emergency Preparedness 'Starter Kits' project, funded by a \$400 Council grant, a \$500 CALSCA contribution, generous private donations (including 'paying or giving forward'), business donations, 'in kind' contributions. 14% of residents letterboxed accepted kits.
- <u>supporting</u> 80 resident's active participation in the CALSCA initiated **Bush Fire Alert Phone Tree**, currently coordinated by Vice-President **Richard Mount**. CALSCA also assisted Lower Channel Community group with the development of their Phone Tree and Emergency 'starter kit' projects.
- representations to Parks & Wildlife Service (PWS) on issues relating to **Coningham Nature Recreation Area** and **Little Coningham Beach**, for which PWS has management responsibility.
- organising / sponsoring community activities to bring together and benefit our community, such as:
 - Working Bees to undertake plantings and clean-up activities at Little Coningham Beach using a grant from Landcare Tasmania and at Coningham Beach with Council assistance.
 - Clean Up events with Snug Landcare Group to remove rubbish from our beaches and roadsides.
 - o **Twin-Loops** fun time trial event held in April, followed by a community BBQ.
 - the well-read Book Club and the fledgling Birdwatching Group.
